COMMUNITY COLLEGE COURSES

New Way's CORE Seniors are prepped and ready to begin their community college courses on Tuesday. Students have successfully completed the enrollment process, requested accommodations, and purchased classroom materials. Students enrolled in CPD150 will travel to Paradise Valley Community College on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Students enrolled in Rio Salado courses will dedicate their Tuesday and Thursday afternoons to completing online coursework. Both groups will have structured worktime on Friday. We look forward to supporting our students as they flourish in the post-secondary setting this semester.

GAME OF LIFE

On Mondays and Wednesdays when students are not completing community college work, we will continue our Game of Life lessons on financial literacy. Mrs. Keathley's CORE students have developed a strong understanding of paycheck vocabulary, budgeting tools and fixed versus variable expenses. Next week, students will learn about credit and debit cards. Mrs. Morgan's CORE group will begin this curriculum in the coming weeks after adjusting to their CPD150 course load.



TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS

New Way has partnered with an online resource, <u>Parchment</u>, to facilitate transcript requests. As of this week, seniors' first semester grades have been updated and uploaded to Parchment. As you complete post-secondary and professional applications, this online tool is the only way to request official transcripts. SENIOR PSYCHOEDUCATIONAL TESTING

COMMUNITY SERVICE REQUIREMENTS

As a requirement for graduation, students need to complete 40 hours of community service. Students have a log at the front of their daily planner to record their hours and are encouraged to complete 10 hours each quarter. These hours provide an opportunity for students to practice their professional skills in the community while exploring areas of interest. Students are encourage to have at least 20 hours completed.

FINANCIAL AID

Families do not need to wait for 2016 tax information to complete the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid</u>. The application is open now and you are able to use 2015 tax documentation! We recommend that students complete scholarship applications as soon as possible as it will help determine what federal aid they qualify for. Thus, allowing for more time to make informed financial decisions before enrolling in a post-secondary program. <u>College Goal Arizona</u> will host workshops in the greater Phoenix area; and <u>here</u> is another great resource for filling out the FAFSA.
